Fountain Hills residents will have the opportunity to meet and talk with U.S Rep. Harry Mitchell with his "Congress on Your Corner" one-on-one listening sessions this week.

Mitchell will host a Community Action Day tomorrow, Thursday, July 2, from 9:30 to 11 a.m. at the Fountain Hills Community Center.

"I'm excited to have another opportunity to listen to my constituents one-on-one," Mitchell said. "I also look forward to our Community Action Day activities.

"Identity theft has become too common and a simple act like shredding documents with personal and sensitive information can go a long way to protecting your identity and financial security."

Residents will have an opportunity to ask a question, share a concern, or just say hello in a one-on-one setting.

In addition to the traditional "Congress on Your Corner" meetings with Mitchell, there will be opportunities to shred personal documents to help protect from identity theft and to recycle compact fluorescent lights (CFL), which is important in protecting the environment.

Members of Mitchell's staff will also be on hand to assist constituents in resolving issues with federal agencies, departments or programs, including passport inquiries.

Please limit maximum number of boxes for shredding to two and remove all staples, bindings and rubber bands in advance.
